Ratby Parish Council hopes that you have all enjoyed a happy, peaceful and blessed Christmas.

We apologise to everyone who wanted to enjoy the lights on the Christmas tree. Someone put themselves at great risk of electrocution as they went to a lot of trouble destroying the display. **That person should feel thoroughly ashamed of their actions**. It was far too late to get replacement lights and all the associated kit in time for Carols around the Tree the following Wednesday. None of the equipment can be used again but rest assured the cost of replacement for 2010 festivities will not fall directly on us, the ratepayers, and your council will take whatever steps are necessary to recover about £1000 from the perpetrators. Our grateful thanks go to the anonymous person who reported the incident and to the police for their very prompt attendance. We must also record our sincere thanks to the council staff who having spent so much time putting the lights in place just a week earlier then had to spend time removing them and making sure that there was no residual danger to the general public.

Five parish councillors turned out on that cold wet Wednesday evening to lend their voices to the traditional Carols around the Tree and wish to express their thanks to Rev Anne Stratton for organising it, Mrs Husband for allowing everyone to move out of the rain into the school hall, to the school choir for their beautiful contributions, and to Ratby Co-operative Band for providing the music.

133 new homes? We must say a very big thank you to those of you who volunteered to, or allowed your arm to be twisted into, delivering letters around the village: some houses may have been missed but we know from the results that we didn't miss many. Thank you also to those who responded either directly to HBBC or to the parish office; all your responses have been registered. We would normally expect about 10% response to a petition of this nature and we achieved twice that – well done everybody. We are pleased to report that the Application has been refused.

Thanks must also go to the County Council highways team for the build-out at the bottom of Chapel Lane. Yes, we know some people don't like it and others ask why it wasn't done a long time ago; council is pleased that it has now been achieved and gives greatly improved visibility at that junction.

Council have accepted the donation of a second rare black poplar from Iris Hannaford, your Ratby Tree Warden, thank you Iris. As a matter of security we do not intend to say where it will be placed but those of you who know and love trees will recognise it straight away.

Dear Editor,

I am writing further to your comments regarding your concerns over our services. I can confirm that both the £20.00 (Midlands) and £14.00 (City Plus) tickets are valid on both the services mentioned (26 and 27 buses) The only difference in the two is that the City Plus version can only be used as far as Ratby. For journeys past this point you would need a Midlands TEN TRIP Ticket.

Your comments have been passed to the area manager who is responsible for our inspectors. They in turn will be spoken to and advised accordingly.

RATBY CONSERVATION AREA

Did you know that Ratby is at risk of losing its conservation area status? In 2009 English Heritage conducted a national survey of conservation areas. 1 in 7 was found to be at risk from neglect, decay, or changes which spoil its character. Ratby is one of those at risk.

Why does it matter? It matters because conservation areas help to preserve the special character of places. It is about recognising the significance of that area and its irreplaceable distinctiveness.

What can be done? Property owners, the Council and community can all work together. Property owners can repair wooden windows instead of replacing them with plastic frames.

The Council can identify inappropriate street clutter and traffic calming, as well as neglected green spaces. The community can join a local amenity group to comment on planning applications, and advise the local authority on what needs to be done.

By pulling together we can ensure that Ratby keeps its conservation area status.
